


Read, Walk, Talk and Explore in the Outdoors!



My forest is green, what colour is yours?

This kit is designed to invite families and children to be curious artists as they explore nearby forests and natural surroundings. You are invited to read and wonder together, walk and talk outdoors and be creative with the materials. Your play kit includes...

1SFCPPL? *Let's Read and Talk* about the world outside our windows. Notice the comparisons in the illustrations (e.g. big and small, crispy and soft) and the different colours.

Construction Paper/Writing Materials *Let's Walk and Talk and Create!* Explore a nearby trail or natural outdoor space or plan a visit to the **Mattawa Conservation Authority** with the pamphlet included. During or after your walk:

- Sketch what makes you curious. What colours do you see? What sounds do you hear? What textures do you notice? What is similar or different from the book?
- Be a curious artist. Use the construction paper to show what your forest looks like. Use the paper bag that holds this kit as a blank canvas to draw, write and create. You can also use it on your walk to carry some of the treasures you find along the way (leaves, sticks, rocks, etc.)
- Find a place to sit and listen. How does your forest sing and dance? Make movements to the sounds.

Outdoor Lay Postcard: This postcard celebrates learning outdoors throughout the seasons. Learn more about different types of risky play and the benefits.

Outdoor Nature Activity Cards: Take these cards with you on a walk. Each one invites you to explore the outdoors from observing clouds to making mud pies and much more!
